I don't think you're right

In English, we usually use I don't think with an affirmative verb I don't think I know you. NOT I think I don't know you.) :
We do the same with believe , suppose , and expect . I don't expect we'll meet again. My friends didn't believe I'd do a bungee jump!	
We can also use seem, expect, and want with the negative (+ object) + infinitive: She doesn't seem to be very happy.	
I don't expect to get the job. I don't want to go back to that restaurant.	
He doesn't expect us to pass the exams.
